Local company beats international competition to secure major wind farm contract

Victorian supplier Olex Cables has proved it is able to compete in both price and capability with overseas manufacturers after securing a contract to supply medium voltage cable to south west Victoria's \$1 billion Macarthur wind farm project.

ICN Great South Coast Regional Manager Peter McCracken advised Olex Cables that the product was potentially to be imported. The company subsequently submitted a competitive bid to supply the product, highlighting the benefits of using a local manufacturer.

The Macarthur wind farm project is being constructed by Leighton's and Vestas contractors, on behalf of the AGL Energy Limited and Meridian Energy joint venture. It is anticipated to generate 220 construction jobs until completion in 2013, with 30 ongoing jobs for the life of the wind farm.
